

## 500 at Launching of **\$912.000** Ferry

Charlotte Murray of Flushing smacked a champagne bottle on the nose of a \$912,000 streamlined ferry boat yesterday and immortalized in city records a Revolutionary heroine.

The new municipal ship, second of three, is the Mary Murray. In 1776, history has it, Mary Murray beguiled British brass hats with

beguiled British brass hats with wine and cakes—and covered the retreat of Gen. George Washington from the Battle of Long Island. Mary Murray was Charlotte Murray's great-great grandmother. Mayor LaGuardia looked on at the ceremony in the yards of United Dry Docks, Inc. at Mari-ner's Harbor, Staten Island. The ship, with its streamlined mates, will go into the Staten Island-Bat-tery service.
